#### A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

It has been a year now since I was officially called as Lead Pastor at St. Matthew. In some ways it feels like it's been longer, especially considering my time as Associate Pastor and serving during the interim. In other ways it feels like less time has passed, perhaps because I only just finished moving all my things into the senior pastor office a few months ago! This past year has been a year of rebounding and growth. We are blessed with new members, rising worship attendance, and expanding Sunday School ministries. We are blessed by the involvement of current members, the deepening of our relationships with one other and with God, and the ministry we are doing for our community and the world. At a time when many churches are struggling, St. Matthew is growing and making a positive impact in the lives of our members and our neighbors.

One exciting opportunity God has presented us with is the opportunity to discern extending a call to our Director of Christian Education Ryan Heckman to serve St. Matthew as an ordained pastor. Ryan graduated seminary last May and is geographically restricted to Connecticut, so he has been awaiting his first call to be an ordained pastor. In the meantime, we have been blessed to have Ryan serving as our Director of Christian Education; and now we have the chance to consider the blessing it might be to have him transition to a new role as Associate Pastor.

This coming month we will have several meetings to discuss this possibility of offering Ryan a half-time call as an ordained pastor. First, on Sunday April 21 during Adult Forum, St. Matthew's Church Council and I will answer questions about our process, financial impacts, and job description. The following Sunday April 28 during Adult Forum, we will have a meet & greet reception for a time of fellowship and informal conversations with Ryan. Then on Sunday May 5 we will have a call vote Sunday: Ryan will preach and the congregation will vote on whether or not to offer him a call to be Associate Pastor.

We hope you will join us on these important dates and prayerfully consider if this is where God is calling our congregation. I look forward to discerning this together!

#### **STEWARDSHIP: THRIVENT ACTIONS TEAMS!**

#### FROM THE DIRECTOR OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Alleluia, Christ is Risen!

We have just heard the choruses of "Alleluia" and have stuffed ourselves to the brim with Cadbury eggs, marshmallow peeps, and possibly had to deal with a pet getting into all that shredded Easter basket grass.

The shine of Easter Sunday seems to somehow dim as we head back into regular routines that are quieter than the trumpet blasts heralding Christ's resurrection. And yet... Easter is an entire 50 day period of feasting and celebration!

That's right, we're called to celebrate Christ's Resurrection every day for 50 days, a time called "Eastertide." The season ends at Pentecost on Sunday, May 19.

How might you participate in this glorious 50 days of feast and celebration?

At church, you'll see the white altar cloth that is trimmed in gold remain on the altar, the Easter lilies will decorate the sanctuary for as long as they can, the Paschal Candle (the big tall one) will be lit each Sunday signifying the presence of Christ - alive and among us, and we'll continue to sing out "Alleluias" and "Glorias" in celebration of Christ's resurrection.

In ancient times, this was a period of great feasting after a long wintertime fast. For example, it is an ancient tradition to forgo meat during the 40 days of Lent and add it back into the diet during Eastertide. You can imagine this tradition arose, in part, out of necessity in the northern hemisphere. Winter is long and foodstuffs are short, so a period of fasting not only marks the 40 days of Lent but stretches the pantry a bit further into spring. At Easter, people celebrated Christ's resurrection and ate to their fill! They added rich meats back into their diets knowing that warm weather will, with God's help, bring new food to restore the pantry.

In my family, we had a tradition of having a giant Easter meal that we called a "Three Meat Meal." We would have ham, turkey and beef all available. It was a luxurious and extravagant meal that we only did once per year on Easter to celebrate Christ's victory over death and God's gift of grace and love to the world.

How does your family celebrate on Easter Sunday? How might you carry on throughout the other 50 days of Eastertide? Might you consider ways to invite others into your celebration through giving away some of the abundance of your table? Or perhaps you have skills, an art, or a talent that you can give to others "to the Glory of Christ's resurrection."

However you celebrate the 50 days of Eastertide, I hope you feel the very real presence of God's abundant grace and love for you throughout.

Alleluia, Christ is risen! He is risen indeed, Alleluia!

# **April 2024**



Dear St. Matthew Lutheran Church,

One year ago this week, members of St. Matthew voted overwhelmingly to extend a call to Pastor Brian as Senior Pastor. Identifying a leader was a vital step to rekindle our church family as we emerged from a worldwide pandemic.



During our process of discernment, we identified three goals via our congregational survey:

- 1. Provide more opportunities for Christian education and spiritual formation at every age and stage of life.
- 2. Create more opportunities for people to form meaningful relationships within the congregation.
- 3. Adapt the opportunities provided by the church, making them more accessible given the pace and schedule of life.

Shortly after this, the Church Council set about to identify a lay leader to spearhead an effort to invigorate our Christian education programs. After many months of prayer and patience, Pastor Brian was contacted by Ryan Heckman, a recent graduate of Luther Seminary with a Master of Divinity and a candidate for ordained ministry. During the past five months, Ryan has quickly made a positive impact. His presence in Sunday school, children's sermons, confirmation and high school youth group is establishing a solid foundation for growth.

At the March 19 meeting, the Church Council, acting as the Call Committee and in consultation with the finance committee and the synod office, voted to recommend that the congregation extend a half-time call to Ryan Heckman as Associate Pastor beginning September 1, 2024.

Please note the following steps moving forward:

- Sunday, April 21 Pastor Brian and the Church Council will hold a Q&A during Adult Forum. We will discuss our process, financial impacts, and job description, as well as answer any questions.
- Sunday, April 28 Meet & Greet reception with pastoral candidate Ryan Heckman during Adult Forum.

#### NOTICE OF SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING

Date: Sunday, May 5, 2024

Time: Immediately following the worship service

Purpose: To vote on extending a half-time call to Ryan Heckman as Associate Pastor

- Pastor Sara Anderson, Associate to the Bishop, will preside over the meeting.
- A two-thirds vote of confirmed members is required.
- An additional vote on a compensation package will take place.
- No other business will be conducted at the meeting.

We are in a period of revitalization, focused on the goals the congregation identified. We invite you to prayerfully consider this next step with us as we discern where God is leading St. Matthew.
