### INTRODUCTION FROM NEW DIRECTOR OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION, RYAN HECKMAN

I am thrilled to have the opportunity to work with this vibrant and exciting community at St. Matthew as your new Director of Christian Education. I am a recent graduate of Luther Seminary where I earned my Master of Divinity and spent many loving hours studying our scriptures and our Lutheran catechism. My classmates ended up calling me the "Super Lutheran" in our cohort of graduates because I worked hard to learn the deep connection that our Lutheran tradition has with our scriptures and with the history of our global church.

As the Director of Christian Education I will be focused on the faith formation of all of you, the members of St. Matthew, with particular focus on the children and youth at St. Matthew. You may wonder, "what is faith formation?" It's a 'churchy' phrase that tries to capture all the ways our church works to educate people about the Holy Scriptures and the Lutheran teaching (the catechism) in ways that are accessible to all ages and abilities and prepares you all to become active participants in what Martin Luther calls "the priesthood of all believers." Faith formation includes Sunday School, Confirmation and Youth Group (three major programs I'm charged to focused on at St. Matthew). Faith Formation also includes adult education hour, retreats, bible study, social events and service events within the wider community. It is a life-long process of learning and growing together as part of Christ's Holy Church.

My prayer is that the Holy Spirit will work among us as we study our Holy Scriptures and our Lutheran teachings to help us form a strong faith in Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior, who reveals to us the grace-filled promises of forgiveness, love, and abundant and joyful life which God promises to all of us.

I look forward to getting to know the community at St. Matthew! I can't wait to see how the Holy Spirit is leading us together into our learning and then back out into the world to serve God's creation and all of God's people.

LIGHTS

### A VIEW FROM THE PEW:

It's hard to believe, in the gathering gloom of winter, that, in a scant few weeks, the days will start getting longer. By Christmas, our hearts will make their annual pilgrimage to Bethlehem, while our New England minds often dwell on memories of summer. The season of preparation begins with its own light in with the Hope candle.

Our conversations will more frequently include the phrase "Remember when" followed by a cheerful anecdote from the beach, the mountains, or the back porch. We were guided by the sun, not so many months ago. Now, the night sky beckons our attention.

The Beginning, as meticulously described in the First Chapter of Genesis, is all about God's creation, with one conspicuous linguistic exception. In 1:1, God created (Hebrew bā-rā) the heavens and the earth. God goes on, then, to establish the light and the darkness, Heaven, the seas, and the fertile Earth. The creation story attributes the light and the dark, the sea and the sky, and the fertile soil and its products, to God's very imagination. However, the next specific act of Divine creation (Hebrew, way-yib-rā) doesn't occur, importantly, from a literary standpoint until, verse 20 with the creation of the sea creatures.

In verses 14-19, the story takes a different direction. God's will is that the heavens include lights to separate the day from the night. In verse 16, God *makes* or *completes* (Hebrew, 'āśâ), as distinguished from the action of creation of the very heavens and the earth from nothingness, the "two great lights – the greater light to rule the day and the lesser light to rule the night, and the stars."

It is essential to observe that the notion in Genesis of the formation of the sun and moon is not presented here as out of nothingness. Indeed, the deliberate choice of the language of making instead of creating with reference to the two great lights of day and night provides us with a powerful insight into the purpose of the calling of the people of God.

The origin story extends a critical rhetorical device to those telling and retelling the tale over millennia. God's formation, fashioning, and making of the moon and sun was not an invention of these heavenly bodies. Rather, the author of Genesis wants us to know that our God is clearly separate from the old Egyptian texts identifying the sun and moon by their pagan personifications, Ra and Thoth.

In other words, the lights in the sky have been dedicated to God's purposes.

Humans have no dominion over the lights in the sky. Rather, these lights, verse 18 tells us, "rule over the day and over the night." We humans are under their authority. Perhaps that slips our collective consciousness as the days begin to lengthen again and we slowly, slowly, recover our sense of temporal prerogative.

The full moon provides its luminescent reassurance the day after Christmas this year. We'll gather to tell the stories, old and new, of that time last summer, or a long ago summer, when we thought, for a moment, that the heavenly lights were our servants – over evening walks, cookouts, and evenings with a book in a lawn chair –and that they worked to our purposes. And then we'll pause to tacitly admit that we've always known it's just the other way around.
