It's ironic to me that our culture starts celebrating Christmas so early and then abruptly halts on December 26th (day #2 of this 12-day festival)—Christmas lights vanish from storefronts, Christmas trees are gone from living rooms, and holiday music disappears from the radio. Yet, we know the celebration continues!

I was blessed to have had such a wonderful Christmas with you all. I was reminded what a joy this season is watching children enact the Christmas story during this year's pageant, visiting homes to sing Christmas carols with our confirmation students, singing Silent Night in the candlelight during Christmas Eve service. It is truly a gift to experience this holy season.

One of my favorite things about the time following Christmas is to watch the daylight come back. December 21st was the winter solstice, the shortest day of the year; and now we can watch the days grow longer. And then January 1st provides a time to make New Year's resolutions, to look at ourselves and consider how we want to live better lives in the coming year. 


BIBLE STUDY

FROM THE DIRECTOR OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION

Since my first day on November 1st, it has been a whirlwind! The Sunday school had weekly classes, two intergenerational activities, and did a wonderful job with the Christmas pageant! I've also enjoyed giving the weekly children's message. The Confirmation class has met weekly, and I've worked with Pastor Brian to plan engaging lessons. They have also participated in two service opportunities: serving at Grace Lutheran's Friday Night Meal and Christmas Caroling. There was a Christmas Party for the High School youth on Friday December 22. And Finally, I have started the process of registering for the 2024 ELCA National Youth Gathering. Whew!

In the midst of all this, I have often reminded myself to stay centered on the central purpose of all these youth education and engagement opportunities: to teach about the ways that God is revealing God's Kingdom to us. This central purpose always guides me in my Christian Education work here at St. Matthew.

Several members at St. Matthew have asked about my vision for Christian Education. I think the above central purpose is the best description I have about what guides my vision. I firmly believe that every education opportunity we have, from Bible Studies to Adult Education, from Christmas Pageants to retreats at Camp, offers us an opportunity to engage with the Holy Spirit to catch a glimpse of how God is being revealed through what we are doing and learning.

I want to use the Christmas Pageant as an example because it recently took place. The children were able to embody the Christmas story by playing characters and singing. Performing the story helps them learn basic things like the sequence of events that led to the birth of Jesus. But they also learned so much more than the simple sequence of events. They engaged with the mystery of God becoming enfleshed - of God becoming incarnate in the world through Jesus Christ. They learned that the birth of Jesus is something really special because Angels were involved and those Angels were sent by God! They learned that shepherds visited Jesus because God told them a savior was born! The children learned that our entire congregation stops, listens, and watches when they dress up and tell us this amazing birth story! They learned that Jesus means something deeply important to their families, to our congregation, and to the world.

The implicit messages that our children learn through acting out the Christmas story in goofy costumes have built essential foundations for their later learning and engagement with major theological principles like: God's incarnation through Jesus Christ, Jesus's simultaneous divinity and humanity, the gifts of love, grace, and peace that Jesus Christ brought to us during his lifetime of ministry. And those same gifts of love, grace, and peace given to us eternally through the grace of God in Christ's death on the cross and resurrection.

My vision for Christian Education here at St. Matthew is to enrich each and every learning opportunity, whether that is with pre-kindergarteners or people well into their adult years, with an active engagement in the presence of the Holy Spirit who will help to reveal a glimpse of God's Kingdom right here in our midst! God is at work! Our learning, seeking, and questioning will help us know where God is working and how we can join God's work.
