A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

When I was called as lead pastor of St. Matthew one of the agreements discussed was to have three weeks extra off to provide a break between my associate pastor and lead pastor roles. Rather than doing that when I was called in March, which was the middle of Lent, we decided to postpone it to the summer. Thus, I recently enjoyed some extended time off and had the privilege of travelling to Europe for three weeks this summer!

My vacation actually began in Indiana where I presided over a friend's wedding and was able to reconnect with old college friends. From there I flew across the Atlantic to the Cortona Conference in Siena, Italy. The conference subject was the relationship between science and spirituality. Participants came from all over the world, and I was one of several students and post-docs who were invited with scholarships to attend for free! The experience was part academic conference and part spiritual retreat. We stayed in a medieval monastery which had been converted into a hotel. The sacred aura of the monastery still lingers there. Our conference was small enough (around 50 people) that I pretty much had the chance to get to know everybody. Our speakers presented on topics like astronomy, quantum mechanics, neuroscience, ecology, and the study of consciousness. Spirituality was openly discussed and we had many exciting conversations. Every morning yoga classes and tai chi classes were held before breakfast, and after breakfast we heard from the lecturers. During the afternoons there were various workshops, which included activities like art, music, and holotropic breathwork. We also had a tour of Siena one day, and I joined friends on a more informal tour of the city one night as well. I made many wonderful connections at Cortona and am happy to share more about my experience with anyone who asks!

After the conference I toured Florence and Assisi. I particularly enjoyed walking the streets Saint Francis and Saint Clare once walked and seeing their churches and burial places. After Italy, I travelled to Malta where I swam in the Mediterranean and took a boat tour to some of Malta's islands. The next country on my journey was Sweden. I stayed in Stockholm and spent a weekend with two friends I went to seminary with—one a pastor from Sweden and the other a professor from Norway, both of whom did a year exchange at Luther Seminary in Minnesota. We toured the palace, explored the Old City, and went to the Viking Museum. After Sweden, my final stop was England. I spent two nights in Essex with a friend I first met when I studied abroad in Cambridge during undergrad. I also went to (continued...)

(...continued) London and toured the British Museum. My last night in Europe I stayed with a friend I grew up with in Bethlehem, who now lives in London with his wife and two children. The following day I flew back to the USA and had an extra week off to relax and debrief.

Thank you for allowing this time of travel and refreshment. God was present in so many ways during my journey: in the beautiful landscapes of Tuscany, in the holy streets of Assisi, in the gorgeous sunsets of Malta, in the time spent with old friends in Sweden and England, and in all the new friends I met along the way. I am grateful for the opportunity to travel this summer and also for the joy of returning home after time away.

As we begin the new program year, I look forward to seeing how these experiences will contribute to my ministry at St. Matthew. I look forward to sharing more of what I learned at the conference and during my travels. I look forward to exploring all the ways God was present in your lives this summer. And I look forward to continuing to grow together as disciples of Jesus Christ.

LUTHERAN DISASTER RESPONSE TO MAUI WILDFIRES

Exacerbated by strong winds, wildfires on Maui have claimed dozens of lives and have destroyed homes, businesses and lines of communication. Thousands of people are under evacuation orders, some moving to other Hawaiian islands. Wildfires have also affected the Big Island of Hawaii, and the islands remain vulnerable to more fires this season.

Lutheran Disaster Response is coordinating with the Pacifica Synod and other partners to assess the needs of people impacted by the wildfires. We will work with them to provide for immediate needs and recovery amid the widespread destruction. Lutheran Disaster Response is committed to accompanying recovering communities in the years ahead.
