A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

I am incredibly blessed and honored to officially be called as lead pastor at St. Matthew! Sunday March 19th was a wonderful day and I cannot thank you enough for your love and support and for your confidence and trust. It has been my privilege to serve St. Matthew as associate pastor for three years and as interim senior pastor this past year. I am truly blessed and grateful to you all.

As promised, I wanted to take the opportunity in this newsletter article to elaborate on my discernment process. To begin, when Pastor Julie left in January of 2022, I honestly did not expect to be staying at St. Matthew longer than six months or so. I knew I would be finishing my PhD soon and felt it would be a good time to move on and follow wherever God was calling me next. I imagined it might be in counseling or as a university professor. I wasn't sure, but I trusted God would provide clarity eventually. At first I did not consider a call as St. Matthew's lead pastor an option. As I stated in a newsletter article last summer, associate pastors do not typically move up to the role of senior pastor. I was completely fine with that and open to wherever the Spirit would lead me. I thought of it as entering into a new adventure, trusting God as I embarked into the unknown.

The first thing I needed to discern was whether I would continue in full-time ministry or pursue counseling or teaching full-time while serving as a part-time pastor. During the spring I was too busy to focus much energy on discernment, but during the summer months I prayed hard for God's guidance on which vocation should be my primary one. As I reflected on this decision, it eventually became clear to me that God was calling me to remain in full-time ministry as a parish pastor and to pursue my other callings of counseling and teaching on a part-time basis.

When I reached a sense of clarity regarding which vocation to pursue full-time, the obvious next step was to ask: where? I submitted my Roster Minister Profile and began considering churches in Connecticut, and possibly other New England states, that needed a pastor. Meanwhile, the leadership of St. Matthew approached the Synod to discuss my (continued...)

(...continued) eligibility to be a candidate at St. Matthew. Bishop Jim Hazelwood and Pastor Sara Anderson were very supportive of my discernment process and did not want to pressure me one way or the other. A major turning point for me was when I interviewed with another congregation. I obviously couldn't help but compare it with St. Matthew. And it was after that interview that I started to feel the Spirit's call to remain at St. Matthew. I spoke with friends and mentors. I had a long phone conversation with Bishop Jim. One particularly helpful conversation was one I had with a friend from seminary who is a pastor in Minnesota. Months earlier I saw that she had accepted a call as senior pastor at the congregation she previously served as associate. So I reached out to her about her own discernment process and learned that it was actually when she interviewed somewhere else that she felt called to stay. This fact was very affirming to me and I shared that that was exactly what had happened to me. The clarity I had been praying for was starting to solidify.

Then, in January of this year I took a discernment retreat. I arrived at a retreat center Tuesday evening and stayed through Thursday morning, spending the entire Wednesday by myself in discernment. I disconnected from electronics and spent most of the day reading, walking, or in centering prayer meditation. And by Thursday morning I knew what God wanted me to do. That very day I called Pastor Sara and told her the conclusion I had come to. And thanks to the work St. Matthew's transition team and call committee had already put in, it all happened very quickly once I came to that sense of clarity. Finally, on Sunday March 19th the congregation voted to extend the call to me and I officially accepted the call to be your lead pastor.

I am deeply appreciative of your patience and support while I came to this decision. Thank you to the Call Committee and chair Stephanie Montminy for all your hard work and efforts. Thank you also to the Transition Team and chair Ben Wright for all their hard work. And thank you to Church Council, past president Jason Lindquist, and current president Jack Pietrick, for your support. I am incredibly grateful for the opportunity to continue to be your pastor in this new role. I look forward to all the ministry and growth we will do together. I am excited for what the future holds! Thank you for everything.
