AUTHOR COMING TO ST. MATTHEW

Pastor Brian's doctoral dissertation focuses on the spiritual and mystical experiences people often report during psychedelic-assisted therapy sessions. This type of therapy can be profoundly healing, and patients often report the spiritual experiences they encounter as the catalyst for such healing. One of Pastor Brian's dissertation advisers is Dr. William A. Richards, an Sacred KNOWLEDGE

internationally respected leader in the field. Dr. Richards will be coming to St. Matthew the weekend of May 14-15th to lead a lecture on his book Saturday evening, May 14th at 7:00 p.m. The following day Dr. Richards will lead adult forum at 9:45 a.m. We hope you'll come out to this free event to learn more about what the frontiers of psychiatry are teaching us about consciousness, the divine-human connection, and the potential of spiritual experiences to facilitate healing.

CHURCH COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS

- * A Transition Team was formed and approved by council. They will begin meeting with Pastor Sandi soon. Look for communication from this group in the coming month as they begin to survey our congregation and compile our priorities in our search for a new senior pastor.
- * An Internal Auditor's Report for both the operating fund and the endowment fund was completed and no issues were identified. Council approved the reports.
- * The church picnic is being planned by the fellowship committee and will be held on **June 12**. Mark your calendars now! Come and catch up with church friends you haven't seen in awhile!
- * Council approved the distribution of \$2500 from discretionary funds designated by the Endowment committee to be forwarded to the Lutheran Disaster Response fund designated for Ukraine.

SENIOR PASTOR TRANSITION

The church council formally approved a transition committee at its April meeting. This team, guided by Pastor Sandi, will spearhead the tasks of leading us through the transition process, including conducting conversations with the congregation, collection of information and feedback from members and formation of the formal church profile (known as the Ministry Site Profile, MSP) for use by prospective pastors.
